Since the 9th century merchants from Arabia and Persia have been 6.4.1 6.4 trading along the Mozambican coast, set up trading posts and settled among the African population. MAURITIUS

Perfect holiday destinations for water lovers; surrounded by calm and warm, translucent waters of the Indian Ocean, protected by coral reefs. Various sheltered bays with long stretches of white beaches.

Grand Baie most popular area; protected bay for water activities like swimming, skiing, sailing, snorkelling. Other coastal areas like Tamarin and Le Morne Peninsula for surfing and kite surfing.

Other outdoor activities: hiking in the Black River Gorges NP, also see indigenous timber and bird species.

COMOROS

Ideal for water lovers who want a quiet holiday, away from development like Mauritius. Four islands spread out in the calm and warm water of the Indian Ocean. Many undeveloped beaches where tents can be pitched and a number of days spent in complete peace and quiet.

Galawa Beach on Grande Comore suitable for diving, with diving school and associated infrastructure. Other beaches like Moya on Anjouan for an endless stretch of beach, and Mayotte with good facilities and infrastructure for diving.

Other outdoor activities like hiking up Mount Karthala, the active volcano, boat trips at Niumashuwa turtle reserve on Moheli

Excellent diving and snorkelling at most islands, especially Maldives Victory Wreck near Hulule Island, and Shark Point, coral gardens, tropical fish of all types and colours, incredibly clear water.

Other activities like flights over atolls, visits to isolated islands for a night under the stars, diving safaris.
