- 5.1 5.1.1 Tsodilo Hills have more than 4 500 pieces of rock art.✓ It is also known as the open-air Louvre.✓ There are four hills, namely Male Hill, which is the second highest hill in Botswana on which the Hambukushu people believe that God created mankind;✓ Female Hill where, according to San legend, the Gods of Old, e.g. a giant serpent with spiralling horns, lived in caverns deep within the hill.✓ There is a small museum✓ and a campsite with ablution facilities and running water.✓ (Any 5 × 1) (5)
- 5.1.2 From the dense riverine forests✓ and swamp lands✓ of Chobe and Linyanti to the mopane forests✓ of Nogatsaa, and then across to the open grassy plains✓ and rocky kopje outcrops✓ of Savuti in the southwest. (5)
- 5.1.3 Believed to be erected around AD 1100, with building developments probably into the 15th century. It is a magnificent, ruined city of Roman proportions (over 772 hectares), the largest stone structure ever built south of the Sahara. Kings and rulers stayed there for over four centuries. Areas include the Hill Complex, the Valley Complex and the Great Enclosure. (5)
