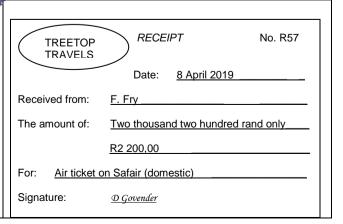

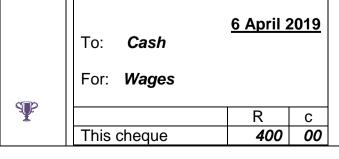

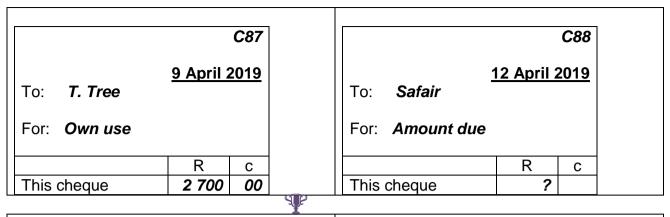

After comparing the bank statement and cash journals of Treetop Travels, information is given with which you are required to:

- 2.1 Make the supplementary entries in cash receipts and cash payments journals (Bank column only). (10)
- 2.2 Post only the totals of the journals to the general ledger and balance the account. (7)
- 2.3 Compile a bank reconciliation statement on 31 January 2019 to reconcile the balance of the bank account with that of the bank statement. (10)

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INFORMATION:

- a) The bank statement showed a credit balance of R529 000.
- b) The bank account showed a debit balance of R521 520 on 1 January 2019.
- c) The total of the Bank column in the cash receipts journal on 31 January 2019 was R120 850.
- d) The total of the Bank column in the cash payments journal on 31 January 2019 was R101 325.
- e) Bank charges according to the bank statement were R850.



- f) A deposit of R15 750 from T. Mbongo was received on the last day of the month. The amount appears in the cash receipts journal, but not on the bank statement.
- g) A debit order in favour of Telkom was debited on our bank statement, R5 725.
- h) A credit entry on the bank statement is for a deposit that G. George made directly into our bank account, R24 360.
- The following cheques have not yet been presented for payment:

- j) An R/D cheque was returned by the bank because it is post-dated. The cheque for R15 880 was received from T. Smith.

- I) A deposit made by D. Manyana directly into our bank account does not yet appear in the cash receipts journal, R28 020.
- m) A debit order in favour of Outsurance for R13 600 has been deducted from our bank account.
